Jon Faust is the Louis J. Maccini Professor in the Economics Department and Director of the Center for Financial Economics at Johns Hopkins. Prior to joining Hopkins in 2006, he spent nearly 20 years in the Federal Reserve System, rising to the position of Assistant Director in the International Finance Division. In that position, he directed research into both international finance and trade. He was educated at the University of Iowa (B.S., economics, 1981), Oxford (M.Phil., economics, 1985), and Berkeley (Ph.D., economics, 1988).

Faust regularly consults with central banks throughout the world and has held visiting faculty posts at Princeton University, Georgetown University, and at the Center for Applied Economics and Policy Research at Indiana University. He is currently editor of the Berkeley Journals in Macro. Faust is widely published in scholarly journals on a broad range of topics at the intersection between finance and macroeconomics.

Faust is married to Maggie Little, a philosopher and bioethicist; he has two daughters, Helen and Kate.
